Monthly Report<br>December 2010

## Kindergarten

December brought many exciting activities to Beaumont's Kindergarten classrooms. We kicked off the month with a weeklong unit on hibernation. The children learned about animals that hibernate, why they hibernate, and the ways those animals prepare for their long slumber. They created their own "hibernating bears" and added them to a bulletin board display where they will "hibernate" throughout the winter months.
After that we jumped right into our "whimsical" activities with the Gingerbread Man. This theme always brings a certain magical feel to the month of December. We read many versions of the age-old tale about the Gingerbread Man throughout the month. One of our literature-based activities included creating a giant gingerbread man cookie, baking him in the oven, and as usually happens, we ended up chasing that little rascal all over the school. As he left clues to his location, he could be heard chanting, "Run, run as fast as you can, you can't catch me, I'm the Gingerbread Man." Fortunately, we did track him down and then we enjoyed having a little gingerbread snack for all our efforts!

In addition, the children continued with their journal writing using their "gingerbread journal". And in math, through hands-on exploration, we continued to expand our lessons on number sense and graphing.

We culminated the month with our annual Gingerbread Tea. This event extended an invitation to our parents to join us in the classroom to enjoy a day of creativity. Together with their children, parents created a stuffed gingerbread man using all sorts of fabric and notions to decorate their unique masterpiece. The children then took their creations home as a remembrance of this special event in Kindergarten.

## First Grade

We can't believe that 2010 is already coming to a close! First graders have been working on strategies to apply in addition and subtraction. These include always beginning with the
 larger number, doubles, doubles plus 1, doubles minus one, using a number line, counting on/up, and fact families. "Additionally," the children are expected to explain through words or pictures why they selected a particular strategy. They extend this skill when solving our weekly word problems, especially the "bonus" problem.
First grade wishes everyone a happy and healthy New Year. We'll see you in 2011!

## Second Grade

December is always a crazy month for Beaumont. We have so much going on in second grade alone! We started our study of the ancient culture of China. We are learning about how the early inhabitants of
 China helped shape the world we live in today. We can't wait to learn all about silk, tangrams, pandas, and The Great Wall!

In Science, we wrapped up our Balancing \& Weighing unit with our Circus Day! We learned how to juggle, balance feathers on our fingers, and walk on a "wire". We even culminated the experience with a circus show. Now, we are learning about soil. Soon we will know all about humus, sand, and clay. We are most excited to watch our earthworms make compost!

Those are just a few of the December highlights. We also enjoyed writing to our secret buddies, learning about the different winter holidays, listening to the fourth-graders' holiday stories and of course, our holiday party and sing-along.

## Third Grade

This month, the third graders were working hard on our Tribal
Tribute project. We hope you were able to visit our Tribal Tribute last Friday, the $17^{\text {th }}$ of December. If so, we bet you were amazed at what you saw ©


As a math project, the third graders will be working with "Tangrams." We will work on putting the seven tangram pieces together to form the traditional square. After the break we will be using these pieces to build other geometric shapes.

## Fourth Grade

December seems to be one big blur in $4^{\text {th }}$ grade! The $4^{\text {th }}$ graders returned from Thanksgiving break and were immediately introduced to their next big project - the traditional Winter Stories. The hard work began with coming up with a creative idea, writing the rough draft, proofreading and finally
 beginning the "fun" stage of writing the final draft in a large book filled with lots of pictures, colors, and of course glitter! The $4^{\text {th }}$ graders are looking forward to sharing these stories with K-3 ${ }^{\text {rd }}$ grades on December $22^{\text {nd }}$. In social studies, classes are finishing up the study of colonization and we will be introducing the next unit, The American Revolution, after the holidays. In science, the students are immersed in the new unit Electricity. They have created circuits, learned about light bulbs and will be constructing houses and wiring them.
We know after this busy month of December that students and teachers will truly enjoy the winter break. May this holiday season bring everyone lots of joy and peace. We wish you a very happy and healthy New Year!

## Special Areas \& Support Areas

## ESL

ESL has been working hard! We have been discussing all of the wonderful traditions and holidays celebrated around the world this time of year. The students have been eager to share their particular customs including their favorite foods, traditions, and events that are unique to their home country. We have been incorporating wonderful literature stories into our lessons while making festive decorations such as gingerbread people and snowflake patterns. It is wonderful to hear and share stories of traditions from around the world. We are lucky to have such diversity at Beaumont as it reminds us of the traditions that make us unique!

We are also enjoying our new Reading series as it helps the students learn new vocabulary connected to the English language. Have you heard of Tofurkey? We enjoyed learning about all of the wonderful food associated with Thanksgiving while discussing the story of the Pilgrims and Native Americans. The students shared what they are most thankful for including their homes, good health, families, pets, and teachers. We are excited about continuing to learn key ESL concepts while discussing traditions that ring in the New Year. Felicidades!

## Applied Technology

Kindergarten students are learning how to use tools in Hyperstudio and general computer skills. First grade students have been exploring map skills using cardinal directions and learning a variety of computer skills. Second grade students have just finished learning about grid coordinates. They are starting to explore the concepts of township, county, state, country, continent, and hemisphere in their map skills exploration of the world in the project titled "Where in the World Are You?" Third grade students are researching Native Americans and creating a Native American region map of the US. They are also learning how to create path animation on their maps. Fourth Grade learned map skills focusing on four types of directions: 1) compass directions, 2) scale and distance, 3) grid coordinates, and 4) symbols. After practicing using each type of directions students were challenged to create a mystery with clues using the various types of directions. Mysteries included roving aliens, hidden treasure, lost pets, and even missing cheeseburgers. Students played each others mysteries after completing their own mystery.

## Library

Kindergarten will finish reading folktales before the winter break. In January they will hear some of our new literature. If you have a first grader, ask them about Kamishibai stories from Japan. Second grade will continue hearing Chinese folktales. Third graders will finish their dictionary unit in early January. After
using both print and internet sources to complete their Pickle questions, fourth graders picked their animals for a research unit. This unit will last about six teaching cycles. These lessons are designed to help get your fourth grader ready to work on their PAL project in the spring.
The Beaumont 100 Book Club sheets are coming into the library. The "Reading Tree" continues to have personalized leaves added to its limbs. Our first drawing for the bigger prizes will be just before Winter Break. If you need a new beginning sheet, just ask in the library and we will gladly provide one.

## Music

Students in music class have been learning about the Russian composer, Piotr Tchaikovsky. Kindergarten, first, and second grade students have been experiencing Tchaikovsky's music from the well known "Nutcracker" ballet, while the third and fourth graders are studying some of Tchaikovsky's other great works, such as "Swan Lake", "Sleeping Beauty", and the "1812 Overture".

The band, chorus, and orchestra students are also continuing to make beautiful music. Parents should check the music calendar weekly, located on the Beaumont Elementary School website to know exactly when rehearsals and lessons take place. Any $4^{\text {th }}$ grade student who is not currently in chorus but would like to join for the Spring Concert is welcome to start attending rehearsals in January. FOR ATTENDANCE IN ALL GRADES SCHOOL REGULATIONS in 2011/2012 children need the following:

- 4 doses of tetanus*
(1 dose on or after the $4^{\text {th }}$ birthday)
- 4 doses of diphtheria*
( 1 dose on or after the $4^{\text {th }}$ birthday)
- 3 doses of polio
- 2 doses of measles**
- 2 doses of mumps**
- 1 dose of rubella (German measles)**
- 3 doses of hepatitis B
- 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine or history of disease
*Usually given as DTP or DTaP or DT or Td
**Usually given as MMR

Children AT'TENDING $7^{\text {th }}$ grade in 2011/2012 need the following:

- 1 dose of tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis (Tdap) (if 5 years has elapsed since last tetanus immunization)
- 1 dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV)

These requirements allow for medical reasons and religious beliefs.
If your child is exempt from immunizations, He /she may be removed from school during an outbreak.
